Von diesen Stücken existiren drei ältere Ausgaben. Die erste erschien um 1724 bei Witvogel in Amsterdam, und wurde bald von John Walsh in London nachgedruckt, aber correcter, wie der Titel sagt. Beide Ausgaben enthalten 12 Nummern. Die dritte Ausgabe von Arnold hat auch 12 Sonaten, lässt aber von den vorigen zwei aus und bringt dafür zwei neue. N<sup>o</sup> 1<sup>a</sup> und 13 sind von uns zum ersten Male gedruckt.

*Three old editions exist of these works. The first was published about 1724 at Amsterdam, and was soon copied by John Walsh in London, but "more correct," as the title says. Both editions contain twelve numbers. The third edition, by Arnold, has also twelve sonatas, but omits two which are in the older editions and gives two new ones in their place. Nos. 1 and 13 are printed by us now for the first time.*




